SETTING THE SCENE

- The Mustangs will return to the Hilltop to host James Madison for **Homecoming** and its **100th Anniversary Celebration**.
- SMU is led by junior QB **Matt Davis**, who had 392 yards of total offense last week at TCU and freshman WR **Courtland Sutton** who has a TD catch in all three games this season, the longest such streak at SMU since Keenan Holman's three-game streak in 2013.
- The biggest-ever Mustang Band halftime show will feature the **World's Largest Diamond M** and the crowning of the Homecoming King and Queen. The first 5,000 people to enter the stadium will receive a **free Peruna bobblehead**. A celebratory extravaganza and **fireworks display** will immediately follow the game and cap this special weekend. And Bob Tomes Ford will be giving away a **Ford Mustang** to one lucky fan.

THE SERIES

- This will be the **first meeting** between the two programs.
- SMU is **42-42-3** in Homecoming games, including a 9-6 mark at Ford Stadium. SMU began its Homecoming tradition in 1926, when the Mustangs edged archrival TCU 14-13.

THE COACHES

- Chad Morris** is in his first season at the SMU helm. Prior to arriving on the Hilltop, Morris spent five seasons as an collegiate offensive coordinator (Tulsa (2010); Clemson (2011-14)). Prior to his stint in the college ranks, Morris was a high school coach for 16 seasons, posting a 169-38 record. In his final prep stop, Morris led Lake Travis High School to back-to-back 16-0, state-championship seasons in 2008 and 2009.
- Everett Withers** is in his second season with the Dukes, and has posted a 12-4 record up to this point and guiding James Madison to the 2014 FCS playoffs for the first time since 2011.

ABOUT THE DUKES

- JMU has started the season 3-0 and comes into the game ranked No. 8 in the STATS FCS Poll and No. 9 in the FCS Coaches Poll. The Dukes have won 10 of their last 11 contests and are averaging 652 yards of offense and 51 points per game.

TIME IS ON OUR SIDE

While Head Coach Chad Morris has PonyUpTempo as the team's motto, the Mustangs are taking their time with the ball and are ranked **third in the FBS in time of possession**. The Mustangs only trail North Carolina State and Rice.

THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM

SMU has made good use of third down so far in 2015. Currently the Mustangs rank **25th among FBS schools on third down conversions** at 46.7 percent.

MAN ON THE RUN

For the second straight week, SMU junior quarterback **Matt Davis** earned American Athletic Conference Weekly Honor Roll recognition after registering a career-high 330 yards passing and 62 yards on the ground versus No. 3 TCU. Davis has led his team in rushing in two of the three games this season, and has been the leading rusher for SMU for nine of the past 10 games, going back to the 2014 season.

In 2014, the Houston native led SMU with 1,468 yards of total offense. His 855 passing yards tied for best on the team and he led the squad with 613 rushing yards. In the last five games of 2014 (all starts), he had 1,270 total yards (735 passing & 535 rushing).

In his first career start at Tulsa (Nov. 8), he had 212 yards passing and 181 yards rushing while totaling three TDs (1 pass, 2 rush). The 181 rushing yards were the most by a QB in SMU history, beating the previous mark set by Ramon Flanigan in 1993 by 31 yards (148 versus Navy). He broke that mark with 191 yards (+145 passing) in the 27-20 win at Connecticut on Dec. 6.

TACKLIN' THE TOP 25

Two of SMU's first three opponents were ranked in the top 5 - No. 4 Baylor & No. 3 TCU. This marks the first time SMU played two top-five opponents in the same year since **1974**, when the Mustangs played at No. 1 Ohio State and hosted No. 5 Texas A&M.

HONORARY CAPTAINS

Head Coach Chad Morris has brought several new traditions to the SMU football program. One of them involves naming an Honorary Captain at each home game.

In games one and two, **Harvey Armstrong** (9/4) and **Reggie Dupard** (9/12) were bestowed this honor.

Armstrong (1978-81) earned All-America honors (1981) and was co-captain of the 1981 National Championship squad. He played eight years in the NFL with the Philadelphia Eagles and Indianapolis Colts. Dupard (1982-85) was selected All-America (1985) and a first-round draft choice of the New England Patriots in 1986.

This week, Morris has selected **Chuck Hixson**. Hixson threw for 7,179 yards and 40 touchdowns from 1968-70. He led the nation in passing as a sophomore, earning the Sammy Baugh Trophy, and guided the Mustangs to the 1968 Astro-Bluebonnet Bowl. He left the Hilltop as the Mustangs' career leader in passing yards and completions.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

In their season opener, the Mustangs were led in receiving by three freshmen - true freshmen **Xavier Jones & Xavier Castille** and redshirt freshman **Courtland Sutton**. So far this season, the freshmen have accounted for 25 of the 50 receptions and 349 of the 667 receiving yards.

With 17 true and redshirt freshmen played in week one, SMU ranked ninth among all teams in freshmen played.

TRIBUTE 23

Prior to the 2009 season, SMU announced that a deserving student-athlete would be chosen by the coaching staff to wear the number 23 to honor **Jerry LeVias**.

LeVias was the first African-American to receive an athletic scholarship in the Southwest Conference. While at SMU, LeVias made athletic and academic All-America teams and, in 1966, contributed to the Mustangs' first SWC title in 18 years. He was an All-American in 1968 and was chosen All-SWC in 1966, 1967 and 1968.

Junior tight end **Jeremiah Gaines** was awarded the number for 2015. Gaines played in nine games, starting three, in 2014, totaling four catches for 97 yards, including a 67-yard touchdown reception against Houston.

TEXAS TALENT

Since arriving on the Hilltop, Chad Morris has made it a point to recruit Texas and to add student-athletes from the Lone Star State.

"You can recruit all the kids you want with 10 dollars in a tank of gas," Morris has repeatedly said.

When he arrived on campus, SMU had just 68 Texans on its roster, the fewest of any FBS school in the state, and had more out-of-state players (31) than DFW Metroplex natives.

SMU's entire 2015 signing class hailed from Texas, and SMU started the season with 77 Texans on the roster.

HONOR ROLL FOR JOSEPH

Senior wide receiver **Darius Joseph** has already left his mark in the SMU record book, ranking in the top 10 in career receptions, season receptions and games with at least 10 catches.

Joseph's single catch against Baylor in the season opener was all he needed to pass Korey Beard for sole possession of the ninth spot, on SMU's career receptions list. His career high is 13 receptions (100 yards & 2 TDs) at East Carolina on Oct. 4, 2014. That led to his first AAC Weekly Honor Roll recognition. The 13 receptions were a career-high for Joseph and tied for the most-ever by an SMU junior, with Joseph joining Emanuel Tolbert, who caught 13 passes as a junior at Baylor in 1978.

3-TIME NATIONAL CHAMPS

SMU is one of just 20 schools that boasts both a **Heisman Trophy winner** and **multiple National Championships**.

Doak Walker won the Heisman following a dominant **1948** season in which he rushed for 542 yards and eight touchdowns, caught 15 passes for 278 yards and two scores, and threw for 304 yards and five TDs. He also returned 10 punts for 169 yards and a touchdown, totaled 161 yards on five kickoff returns, intercepted three passes for 75 yards, averaged 42.1 yards on 35 punts and kicked 22 PATs. He beat out Charlie Justice and Chuck Bednarik for the Heisman.

The NCAA recognizes three SMU teams as National Champions - **1935** (Dickinson & Houlgate), **1981** (National Championship Foundation) & **1982** (Helms Athletic Foundation).

LASECKI & SMITH ON WATCH LISTS

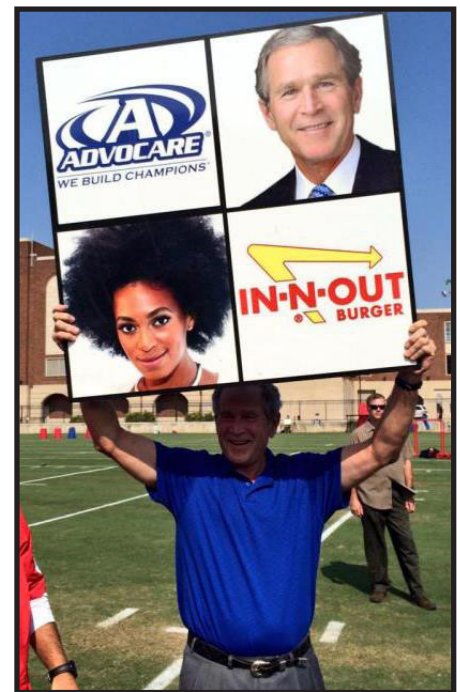
Senior center **Taylor Lasecki** is on the Watch Lists for both the Rimington Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award. This is the third straight year he has been on the Rimington watch list. He is among 63 centers named to the Rimington Watch List. The Rotary Lombardi Award is limited to down linemen, either on offense or defense, who set up no farther than 10 yards to the left or right of the ball, or linebackers who set up no farther than five yards deep from the line of scrimmage.

Senior defensive lineman **Cameron Smith** is among the 80 players on the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List. The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented annually by the All Sports Association in Ft. Walton Beach, Florida. He has also been nominated for the the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, which recognizes college football players from across the country who exemplify a superior commitment to community service and volunteerism.

THE RED CARPET

SMU may need to install a red carpet in the Mustang locker room as SMU has become "the place to be" in Dallas. PONY UP-GRADES!

SMU has made almost **\$10 million in Ford Stadium improvements** since 2011, including upgrades to the locker room and team meeting rooms, a new playing surface, lighting system, suites and club seating.

Renovations included a new team meeting room with stadium-style seating and renovated positional meeting rooms. Changes to the locker room included the creation of a new team lounge, as well as new lockers, updated graphics and audio/visual equipment.

SMU also installed a state-of-the-art MondoTurf 3NX artificial turf system.

Musco Sports Lighting's new system has reduced energy consumption 50% and has saved more than 293 metric tons of CO2 from entering the environment.

In 2013, SMU added a new 233-seat Hall of Champions Club and seven new suites to the northwest corner of the stadium.

In 2014, SMU made significant upgrades to the Stadium Club. The improvements to the nearly 900-seat area included new stadium seats and bar stools. The enhancements also include new carpet and granite countertops.

In 2015, SMU updated its football offices and team areas, installing new graphics and displays.

DON'T ATTACK SHAK

Shakiel Randolph began his senior campaign in a new spot. The former defensive back moved from defensive back to the STAR linebacker position as part of first-year Defensive Coordinator Van Malone's scheme. Last season, Randolph tied for fifth for passes defended per game (1.0) in The American.

DID YOU KNOW?

- SMU offers nationally-rated academic programs, championship-caliber facilities, a top-five media market, fertile recruiting grounds and is a top destination for travel. Dallas features two major airports with direct flights nationwide and is the company headquarters for many of the biggest sponsors in collegiate sports, including 20 Fortune 500 companies.
- SMU has one of the best athletic programs in the country. Teams are competing at the highest level in a plethora of sports. Last year, 12 of SMU's 17 sports finished in the top-3 in the AAC; and eight sports were represented in post-season competition.
- SMU has the third-largest athletic budget of any non-P5 school, trailing only UConn and BYU. Significant investments have been made in the student-athlete experience, including attracting and retaining quality coaches.
 - SMU's infrastructure represents tangible evidence of the commitment to athletics on the Hilltop. A new \$20 million tennis complex and a \$57 million renovation to Moody Coliseum - now one of the most intimidating places to play in college basketball - are the newest additions. Other recent improvements include new throwing field for track, enhancements to the football offices and meeting rooms and golf hitting bays at the Dallas Athletic Club. A \$20 million aquatics center will break ground this winter, and design for golf facilities at Trinity Forest are underway. A facility master plan is in development to address future needs, including an indoor performance center.
 - Since June 2011, SMU has invested almost \$400M in approximately 350 new construction and renovation projects. That work has elevated the campus to No. 2 on Princeton Review's "Most Beautiful Campus" list and No. 8 on the "Best Athletic Facilities" list.
- Baylor and TCU are local examples of what can happen with access to resources. Due to location, academic quality and other factors unique to SMU, the potential exists to develop a program on par with these schools as well as Miami, Vanderbilt, Northwestern and USC.
 - Dallas is a top-five college football market.
- Dallas is home to some of college football's biggest advertisers and sponsors: AT&T, Southwest Airlines, American Airlines, Dr. Pepper, Frito-Lay, Toyota, Exxon Mobil, JC Penney, Gamestop and others.
- Dallas is Texas' No. 1 tourist destination and ranked as the No. 1 sports city in America.
- Texas high school football produces the most Division I football prospects in the country.

FAST LAYNE

Paul Layne holds an unrivaled Mustang record. He has attended every SMU football game for the last 40 years, even going to Tokyo. He had to pull a "fast one" more than once to keep his streak alive.

Layne's unyielding commitment to SMU football has even posed some challenges for family and friends – like the time his ex-wife remarried. He persuaded her to schedule her wedding on a Friday night, within driving distance of SMU's game at Nevada the following day. So the night before the Mustangs tangled with the Wolf Pack in Reno, Layne attended the wedding in California's Sonoma Valley, then drove 200 miles to catch the opening kickoff.

Layne even attended a game dressed in a Halloween costume to disguise his case of adult-onset chicken pox.

Starting when Layne attended SMU and was a team cheerleader, he's attended 459 straight games.

MUSTANG CLUB SETS RECORD

Donors to SMU Athletics once again set a new record for generosity in FY15, contributing more than \$13.3 million, a 24% increase, in support of Athletic Department operations and SMU's 424 student-athletes during the last fiscal year. Included in that total are nearly \$5.3 million in Mustang Club gifts, which provides critical unrestricted support. That total represents an increase of 60% over the previous year's record \$3.3 million result. Total donors also increased 32% from 2,997 to 3,956.

Since Rick Hart's arrival on the Hilltop in 2012, Mustang Club annual giving has more than doubled, from \$2.6 million to \$5.3 million, and donor support of operations has jumped from \$8.4 million to more than \$13 million.

In addition to these gifts, significant investments from donors have been made in SMU Athletics' facilities, including Moody Coliseum, the Miller Event Center and the new SMU Tennis Complex. Fundraising continues for these facilities, in addition to the planned SMU Aquatics Center on East Campus and Trinity Forest Golf Club.

SANDERS SETTING RECORDS

Junior receiver/kick returner **Deion Sanders, Jr.**, was a second-team All-American Athletic Conference selection as a kick returner in 2014. His 759 KOR yards last season rank seventh all-time at SMU. He also set the SMU single-game record with 203 KOR yards at UCF in 2014. At UCF, Sanders' day was highlighted by a 64-yard return that led to a Matt Davis rushing touchdown.

COACH TO CURE MD

For the eighth year in a row, football coaches nationwide will band together for the Coach to Cure MD program, which will be held during games on Saturday, September 26. The annual effort has raised more than \$1.25 million to battle Duchenne muscular dystrophy.

On Saturday, September 26, American Football Coaches Association members, including the SMU staff, will wear a Coach to Cure MD logo patch on the sidelines. College football fans will be asked to donate to research projects supported by Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD), the largest nonprofit organization in the U.S. to focus solely on Duchenne muscular dystrophy.

Football fans can donate to Duchenne muscular dystrophy research by either going on-line to www.CoachtoCureMD.org or by texting the word CURE to 90999.

For the second straight year, SMU will be joined on the sideline pregame by **Graeme McRae** and his family. Graeme has Duchenne and his mother is an SMU alumna.

Last year, more than 10,000 college coaches at more than 600 institutions participated in Coach to Cure MD events. The seven-year fundraising total (2008-14) is now over \$1.25 million.

Duchenne muscular dystrophy is the most common fatal genetic disorder diagnosed during childhood and primarily affects boys of all races and cultures. Boys and young men with Duchenne muscular dystrophy develop progressive muscle weakness that eventually causes loss of mobility, wheelchair dependency and decline in respiratory and cardiac function. Currently, there is no cure for Duchenne muscular dystrophy and limited therapeutic options exist.

"I am always heartened by the level of support our coaches give Coach to Cure MD," said Grant Teaff, AFCA executive director. "Not only by wearing the arm patches, but also many coaches invite young men affected by Duchenne MD and their families out to practices and games. It shows them they are truly part of our team as we do what we can to help them in this fight."

In addition to the coaches efforts, families affected with Duchenne muscular dystrophy will also gather for fundraising tailgate parties on campuses around the country to encourage more fans to get involved.

DALLAS (AP) - Seth Russell threw for 376 yards with three of his five touchdowns to Jay Lee, and the new starting quarterback also ran for a score as fourth-ranked Baylor finally got back on the field with 56-21 victory at SMU.

Played its first game for new coach Chad Morris, the Mustangs, who scored only 12 total points their first four games last season including a 45-0 loss at Baylor, had 21 points in the first 1 1/2 quarters. They were still in the game until two impressive TD catches by Lee in the third quarter.

Russell hit Corey Coleman for a 42-yard gain on the game's first play and Baylor got in the end zone on all four of its possessions in the first quarter. The Bears' first two drives each took less than a minute to cover 75 yards in four plays.

With dual-threat quarterback Matt Davis, the Mustangs immediately responded with touchdowns on their first two drives. Davis threw a 46-yard TD to Courtland Sutton on their first offensive play of the season, and they later connected on a 31-yard score.

Davis finished 16 of 23 passing for 166 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He ran 24 times for 115 yards.

But with SMU at the 3 and within 28-21, Davis was sacked on the final play of the first half. The Mustangs were out of timeouts and couldn't get lined back up for another play.

Baylor went ahead to stay when Russell hit Lee for a 7-yard TD to make it 21-14 with just under 4 minutes left in the first quarter. All three of Lee's catches went for scores.

Chad Morris was named the Head Football Coach at SMU on Dec. 1, 2014. Morris arrived on the Hilltop after five seasons as an offensive coordinator on the collegiate level and 16 seasons as a Texas high school coach.

For the previous four seasons, Morris has served as Offensive Coordinator at Clemson, helping the Tigers to a 41-11 record, the 2011 ACC Championship and four bowl berths, including two BCS Orange Bowl appearances. Clemson also posted three final top-25 rankings, including a top-10 finish in the final USA Today polls in 2012 and 2013. At the time of his departure, the Tigers were ranked 19th in the 2014 AP and USA Today polls. Clemson established 127 offensive records during his four years (89 individual/38 team) and posted the top three scoring seasons in school history, as well as four of the top five passing seasons in Clemson history. For his work, Morris was named AFCA National Assistant Coach of the Year and one of five finalists for National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by 247Sports.com in 2013, and the National Offensive Coordinator of the Year by Rivals.com in 2011.

Among the players Morris tutored at Clemson were 2012 first-team All-American quarterback and ACC Player of the Year Tajh Boyd, 2012 first-team All-American center Dalton Freeman, 2012 third-team All-American wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins and 2013 first-team All-American wide receiver and Biletnikoff Award finalist Sammy Watkins as well as NFLers Dwayne Allen of the Indianapolis Colts, Jaron Brown and Andre Ellington of the Arizona Cardinals, Martavis Bryant of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Tyler Shatley of the Jacksonville Jaguars and Brandon Thomas of the San Francisco 49ers.

Clemson's 2012 team set school records for total offense per game (512.7) and points per game (41.0), ranking sixth in the nation in scoring and ninth in the nation in total offense, and the 2013 offense averaged 507.7 yards and 40.2 points per game. Clemson and Baylor were the only FBS schools with a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver every year from 2011-13.

Morris went to Clemson after one season as Associate Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach at Tulsa. After his arrival, Tulsa improved from 5-7 in 2009 to 10-3 in 2010, averaging 41.4 points per game, eighth-most in the nation, and scoring at least 28 points in 12 of its 13 games. Tulsa was fifth nationally in first downs (25.6) and tied for fifth in touchdowns scored from the red zone (46). His offense scored 64 touchdowns on scrimmage plays (32 rushing, 32 passing) and totaled 1,006 plays (537 rushes, 469 passes).

Prior to his stint at TU, Morris served as a head coach on the Texas prep level for 16 years, coaching at Eustace Independent School District (1994-97), Elysian Field ISD (1998-99), Bay City ISD (2000-02), Stephenville ISD (2004-07) and Lake Travis ISD (2008-09). Morris is a legend in the state after posting a 169-38 record overall and winning back-to-back undefeated state championships in his final two seasons as a prep coach. In all, Morris took six of his teams to Texas State Championship Games, with three of those teams capturing state titles, and earned Coach of the Year honors 11 times.

In his last two years in the prep ranks, Morris led Lake Travis High School to back-to-back undefeated 16-0 seasons as well as two Class 4A State Championships. Lake Travis was the state of Texas' top-ranked offense in both 2008 and 2009. The 2008 team was ranked second nationally by USA Today and eighth by Rivals.com, while the 2009 team ranked No. 2 nationally by Rivals.com and ninth by USA Today.

Morris' offenses enjoyed tremendous success in his two seasons at Lake Travis. In 2008, the Cavaliers averaged 49.0 points per game and had a 41-point margin of victory, while scoring 784 points, the fourth-most in Texas football history, and throwing for 305 yards per game. In that same 2008 campaign, Morris coached former Mustang great Garrett Gilbert, who was named the Gatorade and Parade Magazine National Player of the Year, while setting the state of Texas' single-season passing yardage mark with 4,884 yards and 55 touchdowns. Gilbert also rushed for 790 yards and 28 TDs that season.

In 2009, Lake Travis totaled 7,600 offensive yards for a 475-yard average. LTHS threw for 287.5 yards and scored 44.0 points per game, while defeating opponents by an average of 34 points a game. The Cavaliers put up 4,600 passing yards and 46 TDs, with just seven interceptions.

Before compiling a 32-0 record in his two seasons at Lake Travis, Morris posted a five-year mark of 49-10 at Stephenville High School, where he implemented a hurry-up, no-huddle offense in 2004. At Stephenville, Morris tutored former Ole Miss quarterback Jevan Snead. Snead started the 2004 and 2005 seasons under Morris' tutelage and rushed for 1,053 yards in his senior season. After Snead, Morris coached quarterback Kody Spano, who later played collegiately at Nebraska. Spano threw for over 2,900 yards and rushed for more than 1,000 yards as a senior in 2007.

Before moving to Stephenville, Morris' teams registered a three-year record of 34-8 at Bay City High School, while playing for the state championship twice (2000 & 2001) and winning the crown in 2000 with a 14-1 record. At Bay City, Morris coached quarterbacks Andrew Smith (2000) and Scott Elliott (2001-02). Smith went on to play at North Texas where he led the Mean Green to a Bowl Game in his freshman season, while Elliott played collegiately at Tulane.

Morris' Elysian High School teams advanced to the state championship game in each of his two seasons as the head coach, while posting a 26-6 two-year record. His first team in 1998 compiled a 12-4 record, while the 1999 team compiled a 14-2 mark.

Morris received his first coaching position at Eustace High School as the quarterbacks coach in 1992-93, before taking over as head coach in 1994, leading the school to an 11-1 record in his final season of four years as the head coach. At Eustace, Morris also served as the head boys' basketball coach for four seasons (1993-97) and posted a record of 128-32.

Morris earned his bachelor's degree in mathematics with a minor in statistics from Texas A&M University in 1992.
