The Colonial Athletic Association has established itself as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences both athletically and academically for more than 30 years.

The CAA encompasses many of the nation's largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Charleston, S.C. The conference has produced 15 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 13 national players of the year, 12 national coaches of the year and 13 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 24 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2015-16, more than 2,000 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference had 37 teams in 20 different sports receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on the latest Academic Progress Report released in 2016.


The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes several of the nation's top media markets – New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Washington, D.C. (8) and Baltimore (27). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 19 million.

The CAA conducts championships in 22 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis and track & field. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2015-16, 25 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 40 student-athletes received All-America honors in 12 different sports.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball with two teams – George Mason (2006) and VCU (2011) – advancing to the NCAA Final Four over the past 11 years. CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including 14 victories in the NCAA Tournament. The CAA has posted at least one NCAA Tournament win in six of the past 11 years. The conference has had five or more teams compete in postseason play in five of the last eight seasons.

In women's basketball, CAA champion James Madison made its fifth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last seven years and recorded its 11th consecutive postseason appearance. In 2013, Delaware became the 12th CAA team to reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and Drexel captured the WNIT championship with a 46-43 victory over Utah. CAA teams have recorded 26 victories in postseason play over the past five years.

The conference also excels in many other sports. Four CAA women's soccer teams received NCAA berths for the first time in league history last season and three of them advanced to the second round. The CAA sent multiple teams to the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship for the sixth straight year and each current member of the conference has reached the NCAA Tournament since 2006. James Madison received a #7 national seed in the 2016 NCAA Softball Championship and became the second team in conference history to advance to the Super Regionals, joining Hofstra in 2012. In baseball, UNCW and William & Mary received NCAA berths last season and both advanced to the finals of their respective NCAA Regionals, with the Tribe knocking off defending national champion Virginia. College of Charleston's baseball team reached the NCAA Super Regionals in 2014. William & Mary's Regan Rome earned All-America accolades in cross country and track and field a year ago as a sophomore. Delaware and Towson have each reached the Final Four of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship and the Tigers advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals in 2016 after upsetting defending national champion Denver. For the first time in conference history, two CAA men's golfers – CofC's Will Rainey and JMU's Ryan Cole – advanced to the NCAA Men's Golf Championship. Two CAA teams competed in the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship for the first time since 2010.



as Towson and James Madison received berths. CAA squads have combined to win 10 field hockey national titles since the championship began in 1981. The conference has had at least 11 players selected in 12 of the last 14 Major League Baseball drafts.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university education and life outside of intercollegiate athletics. The Alliance has enabled hundreds of students to showcase their research in the annual Undergraduate Research Conference and Journal, facilitated leadership exchanges to promote professional development, developed an academic resource sharing program to support student athletes, and created opportunities for institutions to partner on a wide range of initiatives that enhance student success.

CAA schools are also very active in community service projects. The CAA Blood Challenge, which is held each fall, has raised more than 43,000 units of blood over the past 14 years. The CAA Food Drive Challenge, which is held each spring, has resulted in over 22,000 pounds of donated food and \$11,000 in cash contributions in only three years.

On July 1, 2016, Joseph D'Antonio began his tenure as only the second Commissioner in the history of the CAA. He replaced Thomas E. Yeager, who guided the CAA since its inception in 1985.

The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when two of its current members - James Madison University and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, George Mason University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new conference. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Old Dominion University joined the CAA in 1991 and was followed by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference in 2005. College of Charleston began its first year as a CAA member in 2013 and Elon University joined the conference on July 1, 2014.

Joe D'Antonio begins his first year as only the second commissioner in the history of the Colonial Athletic Association.

D'Antonio comes to the CAA from the BIG EAST Conference, where he served as the Senior Associate Commissioner for Administration and NCAA Relations. He brings a wide range of experience and accomplishments, including more than a decade of work at the BIG EAST and eight years at Providence College, while also earning appointments to some of the NCAA's most prestigious committees.

"I am honored and humbled to have been selected as the next Commissioner of the Colonial Athletic Association," D'Antonio said. "I deeply appreciate that the Council of Presidents / Chancellors has provided me the opportunity to lead this accomplished group of institutions.

I am anxiously looking forward to partnering with the CAA membership in achieving the Conference's mission of stressing the role of college athletics within the educational framework of the institution."

In his role as Senior Associate Commissioner at the BIG EAST, he was charged with the oversight of the Conference's internal operations and its interaction with the NCAA. His duties included overseeing the Conference's compliance department and the Olympic sport championships department. He also served as liaison to the BIG EAST athletics directors and organized Conference-wide meetings.

D'Antonio is currently a member of the NCAA Division I Council Two-Year Governance Structure Review Ad Hoc Working Group, which has been charged with considering refinements and enhancements to the new NCAA governance structure and legislative process. He was also recently appointed to serve on the NCAA Division I Enforcement and Infractions Review Group.

In addition, D'Antonio was a member of the NCAA Division I Legislative Council from 2008-2015 and was the group's chairperson for two years (2008-2010). He was the chair of the CCACA (Conference Commissioners Association of Compliance Administrators) from 2007-16, and recently served as a member of the NCAA Division I Legislative Committee, which is one of seven subgroups of the NCAA Division I Council.

D'Antonio began his career at the BIG EAST in 2005 as the Associate Commissioner for Governance and Compliance and was promoted to Senior Associate Commissioner for Governance and Compliance in 2009. During that time, he was involved in all aspects of the conference office, including helping to manage and oversee the conference's FBS football program as well as its nationally recognized men's and women's basketball teams.

From 1997-2005, D'Antonio worked as the Associate Athletic Director for Compliance and Administration at Providence College. He served as the athletic department liaison with the financial aid and admissions offices and was a sport administrator for women's softball and men's ice hockey. During that time, he also spent two years as the interim director of athletic facilities and game management.

A 1993 graduate of the New England School of Law in Boston where he earned Dean's List honors, D'Antonio was admitted to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts State Bar in 1994 and worked in private practice until 1997. An Abington, Massachusetts native, D'Antonio received his undergraduate degree from Providence College in 1990.

He and his wife, Karen, have two children, Joseph III (17) and Olivia (14).

CAA CHAMPIONSHIP FUTURE SITES

After six seasons at The Show Place Arena in Upper Marlboro, Md., the CAA Championship is moving back on campus. The 2017 championship will be played at the JMU Convocation Center in Harrisonburg, Va., the 2018 championship will be held at Drexel's Daskalakis Athletic Center in Philadelphia, Pa. and the 2019 championship will be conducted at Delaware's Bob Carpenter Center in Newark, Del. During the six years the Show Place, more than 38,000 fans went through the turnstiles.

HIGH SCORERS RETURN

The offense in the CAA will be plentiful once again this season as 10 of the top-20 scorers from 2015-16 will be back on the hardwood for their respective teams. Out of that group, seven are seniors, two are juniors, and one is a sophomore.

TOP HONORS RETURN

Eight of the 15 All-CAA honorees from last year return for the 2016-17 season, including the two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year, **Bre Bolden** from CofC, and the CAA Rookie of the Year, **Kayla Cooper-Williams** from James Madison. The 2014-15 CAA Player of the Year, **Precious Hall** of James Madison, returns for her final season after missing the entirety of 2015-16 with an injury.

NATIONAL NOTICE

James Madison finished the season receiving votes in both the final Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls. Three teams checked into the top-90 RPI in the final NCAA.com ratings released: James Madison (34), Hofstra (63), and Drexel (90). The CAA was ranked 13th in RPI in 2015-16. Statistically, Drexel finished the season among the top-25 in seven different categories. Notably, the Dragons were third in free throw percentage (78.6), sixth in assist-turnover ratio (1.39), fourth in fewest turnovers (357) and 17th in three-pointers made per game (8.0). Drexel's Meghan Creighton ranked fifth in assist-turnover ratio (3.23). James Madison finished its season on 12 lists, including ranking second in nation in threepoint field goal defense (24.5) and rebounds per game (46.21), ninth in rebounds (1525), tenth in blocks (185), and 15th in rebounding margin (+9.9). College of Charleston's Bre Bolden was 13th in steals per game (2.94) and 15th in total steals (91).

CAA ALUMNAE IN THE OLYMPICS

Two former CAA hoopsters represented their countries in the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio. Former Hofstra standout **Lizanne Murphy** took the floor for Team Canada for her second Olympic appearance while **Elena Delle Donne** became Delaware's first Olympian, helping Team USA to the gold medal.

**FOUR TEAMS IN POSTSEASON PLAY**

Four CAA teams qualified for national postseason play with James Madison heading to the NCAA Tournament and Hofstra, Elon, and Drexel earning bids to the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). The 2016 postseason marked the 11th consecutive year in which at least three CAA teams advanced to the postseason. In addition, it was the 16th consecutive season in which the CAA had a representative in the WNIT. Hofstra advanced to the quarterfinals of the WNIT for the first time since 2007. The Pride began the tournament by knocking off Harvard (76-50), followed by a win at Villanova (82-74) and a victory over ACC foe Virginia (65-57) in the third round. Hofstra's postseason run was halted by Florida Gulf Coast, 61-46, despite a double-double by Darius Faulk.

DRAFTED!!

James Madison's **Jazmon Gwathmey** became the 16th CAA women's basketball player to be taken in the WNBA Draft. Gwathmey was selected in the second round and 14th overall by the Minnesota Lynx. Her draft rights were then traded to the San Antonio Stars, where she is suited up. Gwathmey is the third Duke in JMU women's basketball history to be drafted into the WNBA, joining Tamera Young (Atlanta Dream, 2008 – eighth overall) and Lauren Okafor (Atlanta Dream, 2015 – 34th overall) and the fourth CAA player in the last five seasons to be taken in the WNBA Draft. Her second round pick was the highest for a CAA player since 2013 when Delaware's Elena Delle Donne was taken in the first round. Gwathmey was named the CAA Player of the Year and the CAA Championship Most Outstanding Player for the third time last season while averaging 20.7 points and 6.0 rebounds per game.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE FOR CAA CHAMPIONSHIP SEEDING

Seeding for the Women's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- Head-to-head competition.
- If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

There was a lot to like about the Cougars last season. They got off to a 4-2 start, their best in six years, and finished with 11 wins, doubling their win total from the previous season. CofC put together a great CAA Championship tournament, picking up a win in the first round and nearly knocking off JMU in the quarterfinals. The Cougars return three starters but will have to overcome the departures of forwards Kelsey Booth and Jackie Luna-Castro, who are now playing professionally overseas.

Returning for her senior season is Breanna Bolden, who has been a key component in the CofC lineup. The two-time CAA Defensive Player of the Year had 91 steals last season to put her in the top-15 nationally. Her quickness on both ends of the floor has translated into being the team's leading scorer, averaging 14.1 points last season.

Junior Kelsi Lidge and Sarah Woods are options in the post for Drexel as is sophomore Tereza Kracikova. Megan Marecic should see time in the lineup after missing most of last season with injury. The Dragons also have six freshmen vying for playing time.



Also returning is center Sandra Dongmo, who averaged 4.5 rebounds per game last season, and Aleana Leon, contributed 4.7 points and 3.1 rebounds off the bench and posted some big numbers in the WNIT.

Hofstra brings in five talented freshmen, four of which are guards who all have the chance to break into the starting lineup.



James Madison is the preseason favorites once again and are coming off a season in which they went 27- 6 overall and 17-1 in league play. Griffin is absolutely ferocious on the boards, she ripped down 9.5 rebounds per game last year.

Adding to the front court is 6-foot-3 center Amber Porter, who sat out 2015-16 after transferring from Stetson. Junior Hailee Barron, meanwhile, helps bolster the backcourt, bringing 5.3 points and 2.0 rebounds per game with her.



The biggest surprise of 2015-16 was the emergence of the Huskies. Northeastern had an impressive turnaround, going 15-16 overall and 9-9 in conference play after winning just four games the previous season. The Huskies put together an impressive run in the CAA Championship, knocking off Hofstra to advance to the semifinals.

While the Huskies will have to replace leading scorer and All-CAA First Team selection Samantha DeFreese, they return three starters and several key players, including four sophomores. Third-year Head Coach Kelly Cole will also incorporate four freshmen into the rotation.

Point guard Jess Genco had an impressive rookie season, averaging 9.4 points, 4.2 rebounds and 4.2 assists per game. She logged 38.4 minutes per game, the second most in the nation last year. Forward Gabby Giacone joined Genco on the CAA All-Rookie Team after posting 8.4 points and 5.1 rebounds per games.

Guard Claudia Ortiz complemented Genco in the backcourt, averaging 7.7 points and 4.7 rebounds per game as a sophomore. The Huskies will count on the experience and leadership of senior Francesca Sally, who posted 8.6 points and 5.4 rebounds per game last season.

The Huskies have a tough non-league schedule, which includes a trip to the Cancun Challenge where they will face Stanford, Purdue and Wichita State. Northeastern also has a return game at Michigan State before heading to Denver.

Masaquel had the biggest breakout season, recording 13.8 points and 7.5 rebounds per game. The post player also had 45 steals and 36 blocks en route to All-CAA Second Team and All-Defensive Team accolades.

Senior Latrice Hunter (4.8ppg) and junior Jeanne Gaumont (3.5ppg) are expected to play key roles for the Tribe once again.

Defense remains the bread and butter for William & Mary, with three members of the Tribe ranked in the top-seven in the CAA in steals. William & Mary came away with 280 steals (9.3/g) which led the CAA.
