ABOUT THE LEAGUE

The Colonial Athletic Association has established itself as one of the nation's top collegiate conferences both athletically and academically for more than 30 years.

The CAA encompasses many of the nation's largest metropolitan areas with a geographic footprint that stretches from Boston to Charleston, S.C. The conference has produced 16 national team champions in four different sports, 33 individual national champions, 14 national players of the year, 13 national coaches of the year and 14 Honda Award winners. Just as impressive, however, are the honors accumulated away from competition, which include five Rhodes Scholars and 24 NCAA post-graduate scholars. In 2016-17, more than 2,000 of the league's 4,000 student-athletes received the Commissioner's Academic Award after posting at least a 3.2 grade point average while lettering in a varsity sport. The conference had 39 teams in 15 different sports receive NCAA Public Recognition Awards based on the latest Academic Progress Report released in 2017.

The landscape of the conference stretches along the majority of the East Coast, and includes several of the nation's top media markets — New York (1), Philadelphia (4), Boston (7), Washington, D.C. (8) and Baltimore (27). The number of television homes in the CAA market exceeds 19 million.

The CAA conducts championships in 22 sports. Male athletes compete for championships in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis and track & field. Female athletes battle for conference titles in basketball, cross

country, field hockey, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball. In 2016-17, 25 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths and 42 student-athletes received All-America honors in 13 different sports.

The 2016-17 season was one to be remembered as the conference brought home two national titles. Delaware captured its first NCAA Field Hockey Championship with a 3-2 victory over North Carolina and James Madison defeated Youngstown State to claim the NCAA Division I Football Championship. In addition, Towson reached the semifinals of the NCAA Men's Lacrosse Championship after upsetting 7th-seeded Penn State and 2nd-seeded Syracuse.

The conference has made its presence known nationally in men's basketball. CAA teams have combined to win 43 games in postseason play since 2006, including a pair of NCAA Final Four appearances (George Mason -2006 and VCU - 2011). The conference has had at least five teams compete in postseason play in five of the last nine seasons and was ranked 11th among 32 Division I conferences in the NCAA RPI last year.

In women's basketball, Elon captured its first CAA championship in 2017 while James Madison made its 12th consecutive postseason appearance. In 2013, Delaware became the 12th CAA team to reach the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and Drexel captured the WNIT championship. CAA teams have recorded 26 victories in postseason play over the past five years.

The conference also excels in many other sports. Four CAA women's soccer teams received NCAA berths for the first time in league history in 2015. The conference has sent multiple teams to the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship in six of the past seven years. James Madison received a #7 national seed in the 2016 NCAA Softball Championship and became the second team in conference history to advance to the Super Regionals, joining Hofstra in 2012. College of Charleston's baseball team reached the NCAA Super Regionals in 2014. William & Mary distance runner Regan Rome earned first-team All-America accolades in track and field for the second year in a row in 2017. Two CAA men's golfers — CofC's Will Rainey and JMU's Ryan Cole — advanced to the NCAA Men's Golf Championship in both 2016 and 2017 while CofC's Laura Fuenfstueck reached the NCAA Women's Golf Championship in 2017, finishing tied for 24th overall.

CAA member institutions are committed to excellence in the classroom. The Colonial Academic Alliance was created in 2002 by the league's presidents with a goal of expanding their partnership to all aspects of university education and life outside of intercollegiate athletics. The Alliance has enabled hundreds of students to showcase their research in the annual Undergraduate Research Conference and Journal, facilitated leadership exchanges to promote professional development, developed an academic resource sharing program to support student athletes, and created opportunities for institutions to partner on a wide range of initiatives that enhance student success.

CAA schools are also very active in community service projects. The CAA Blood Challenge, which is held each fall, has raised nearly 45,000 units of blood over the past 15 years.

On July 1, 2016, Joseph D'Antonio began his tenure as only the second Commissioner in the history of the CAA. He replaced Thomas E. Yeager, who guided the CAA since its inception in 1985.

The conference traces its roots back to 1983 when two of its current members - James Madison University and the College of William and Mary - were aligned with East Carolina University, George Mason University, the United States Naval Academy and the University of Richmond as a basketball league (ECAC South). During the next two years, the league added 11 sports, acquired two new members (the University of North Carolina at Wilmington and American University) and decided to form a new conference. The transformation from ECAC South to CAA took place on June 6, 1985.

Old Dominion University joined the CAA in 1991 and was followed by Virginia Commonwealth University in 1995. The conference added the University of Delaware, Drexel University, Hofstra University and Towson University in 2001. Georgia State University and Northeastern University became members of the conference in 2005. College of Charleston began its first year as a CAA member in 2013 and Elon University joined the conference on July 1, 2014.

COLONIAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION COMMISSIONER JOE D'ANTONIO





oe D'Antonio begins his second year as only the second commissioner in the history of the Colonial Athletic Association.

D'Antonio comes to the CAA from the BIG EAST Conference, where he served as the Senior Associate Commissioner for Administration and NCAA Relations. He brings a wide range of experience and accomplishments, including more than a decade of work at the BIG EAST and eight years at Providence College, while also earning appointments to some of the NCAA's most prestigious committees.

"I am honored and humbled to have been selected as the next Commissioner of the Colonial Athletic Association," D'Antonio said. "I deeply appreciate that the Council of Presidents / Chancellors has provided me the opportunity to lead this accomplished group of institutions. I am anxiously looking forward to partnering with the CAA membership in achieving the Conference's mission of stressing

the role of college athletics within the educational framework of the institution."

In his role as Senior Associate Commissioner at the BIG EAST, he was charged with the oversight of the Conference's internal operations and its interaction with the NCAA. His duties included overseeing the Conference's compliance department and the Olympic sport championships department. He also served as liaison to the BIG EAST athletics directors and organized Conference-wide meetings.

D'Antonio is currently a member of the NCAA Division I Council Two-Year Governance Structure Review Ad Hoc Working Group, which has been charged with considering refinements and enhancements to the new NCAA governance structure and legislative process. He was also recently appointed to serve on the NCAA Division I Enforcement and Infractions Review Group.

In addition, D'Antonio was a member of the NCAA Division I Legislative Council from 2008-2015 and was the group's chairperson for two years (2008-2010). He was the chair of the CCACA (Conference Commissioners Association of Compliance Administrators) from 2007-16, and recently served as a member of the NCAA Division I Legislative Committee, which is one of seven subgroups of the NCAA Division I Council.

D'Antonio began his career at the BIG EAST in 2005 as the Associate Commissioner for Governance and Compliance and was promoted to Senior Associate Commissioner for Governance and Compliance in 2009. During that time, he was involved in all aspects of the conference office, including helping to manage and oversee the conference's FBS football program as well as its nationally recognized men's and women's basketball teams.

From 1997-2005, D'Antonio worked as the Associate Athletic Director for Compliance and Administration at Providence College. He served as the athletic department liaison with the financial aid and admissions offices and was a sport administrator

for women's softball and men's ice hockey. During that time, he also spent two years as the interim director of athletic facilities and game management.

A 1993 graduate of the New England School of Law in Boston where he earned Dean's List honors, D'Antonio was admitted to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts State Bar in 1994 and worked in private practice until 1997. An Abington, Massachusetts native, D'Antonio received his undergraduate degree from Providence College in 1990.

He and his wife, Karen, have two children, Joseph III (17) and Olivia (14).


HELLO, COACHES

There will be three new coaches on the sidelines, two of which are familiar faces. Head Coach **Karen Barefoot**

takes the helm of UNCW. She was previously in the league as the leader of ODU. Head Coach **Natasha Adair** returns to the CAA sidelines, taking over the helm of Delaware. Head Coach **Diane Richardson** will guide Towson this season. Richardson was a long-time assistant coach at West Virginia.

NATIONAL NOTICE

Statistically, Drexel was ranked in 10 team categories in 2017-18. The Dragons finished tenth in both three-pointers made (297) and ninth in three-pointers made per game (9.0). They were also 22nd in assist-turnover ratio (1.21) and 17th in scoring defense (56.1). James Madison finished 13th in rebounds (1,466). William & Mary finished the year third in blocks per game (6.2) and eighth in total blocks (191). James Madison's Precious Hall was the national leader in three-pointers attempted (344) and field goals attempted (762). She ranked third in scoring (24.0) and second in total points (841) while coming in ninth in three-pointers made (108) and eighth in free throws made (177). Drexel's Meghan Creighton was tenth in three-point field goal percentage (.441). College of Charleston's Breanna Bolden and Towson Raven Bankston finished in the top-15 in steals. Bolden was 13th in total steals (98) and ninth in steals per game (3.27) while Bankston was 15th in total steals (96) and tenth in steals per game (3.20). Hofstra's Ashunae Durant finished 15th in rebounds per game (10.6) and tied for 17th with Delaware's Nicole Enabosi in double-doubles (16).



IN THE POLLS

In the final College Insider Mid-Major Poll of the season, Elon was ranked No. 2 while James Madison was No. 7 and Drexel received votes. Elon was the only CAA team to receive national attention in the polls. The Phoenix received votes in the WBCA Coaches Poll for the final four weeks of the season.

THREE TEAMS IN POSTSEASON PLAY

Three CAA teams qualified for national postseason play with Elon heading to the NCAA Championship and James Madison and Drexel earning bids to the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). It was the 12th straight year in which at least three CAA teams advanced to the national postseason and the 17th consecutive season in which the CAA had a representative in the WNIT. The 11th-seeded Elon Phoenix fell in the first round of the NCAA Championship to No. 6 West Virginia, 75-62, in their firstever NCAA appearance. James Madison made 12th consecutive national postseason appearance and their first WNIT appearance since 2013, advancing to the third round. James Madison fell to Villanova in the third round at the Convo. Drexel earned an at-large bid to the WNIT and made their third-straight appearance and their seventh in the last eight years. Drexel hosted the first round for the third-straight season. Drexel rallied from a halftime deficit to trounce A-10 foe Duquesne, 70-47, at the DAC but was edged by Villanova.

CHAMPIONSHIP



The CAA Women's Basketball Championship returns to campus for the next three seasons beginning in 2017. First up is the JMU Convocation Center in Harrisonburg, Va.

James Madison has hosted the CAA Championship on six occasions, with the last time coming in 2010.

The JMU Convocation Center has been the home to JMU Men's and Women's Basketball since its completion in 1982. The venue also hosts concerts, conventions and other large meetings with a capacity for 6,426.

TIE-BREAKING PROCEDURE

Seeding for the Women's Basketball Championships will be based on Regular Season Conference Record. In case of ties, ties will be broken from top to bottom. Once a tie is broken and the seeds are determined, the seeds will be used to break any subsequent ties.

1. TWO TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head-to-head competition.
- b) If two tied teams split their two games during the regular season, compare each tied team's record against the team occupying the highest position in the standings and continue down through the standings until one team gains the advantage, thereby earning the higher seed. When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the higher winning percentage shall prevail, even if the number of games played against a team or group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4). If the winning percentage of the tied teams is equal against a team, or a group of tied teams, continue down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.
 - i) When arriving at another pair of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to their own tie-breaking procedures), rather than the performance against the individual tied teams.
- c) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.

2. THREE OR MORE TIED TEAMS:

- a) Head to head competition as determined by the combined record of games among the tied teams involved. Ties will be broken and seeds will be based on the winning percentage of games amongst the tied teams, even if the number of games played against the group is unequal (i.e., 2-0 is better than 3-1; 1-0 is the same as 2-0; 2-0 is the same as 4-0; 2-1 is the same as 4-2; 1-0 is better than 1-1; 0-1 is the same as 0-2; 0-2 is the same as 0-4).
- b) If procedure 2a fails to break the tie, then each tied team's record shall be compared to the team occupying the highest position in the standings, continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage by a higher winning percentage as described in 2a.
- c) If the tie is broken by 2a or 2b regarding one or more teams, but three or more teams remain tied, then procedures 2a and 2b will be re-applied among those tied teams only. If two teams remain tied, revert to the two-tied team procedure.
- d) If a tie still exists, the Ratings Percentage Index, as computed from the RPI Report by 9:00 AM, on the day following the last scheduled conference game, will be used to break the tie. The team with the better RPI will earn the higher seed.






